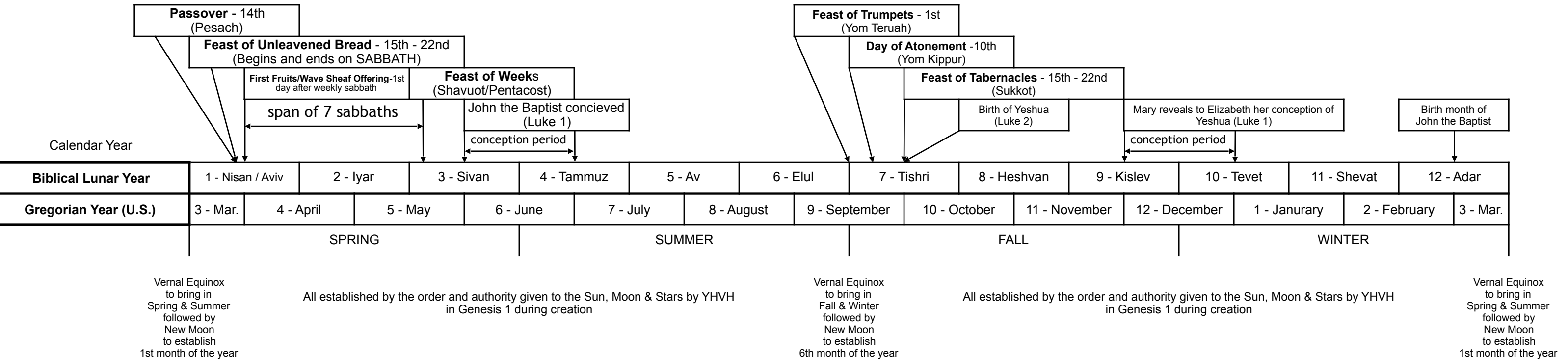


Biblical Hebrew Calendar compared to the Gregorian Calendar



Biblically Accurate Chronology of Yeshua's Death, Burial and Resurrection

Note: Based on the lunar cycle, Passover starts on the 14th day of the 1st month(Nisan) and can be on any day of the week. This timeline is to prove that the Good Friday to Resurrection Sunday concept does not work for modern day Christianity based on the scriptural 3 full days in the tomb.

| Biblical Lunar 24 hour day. Days begin at sundown | Exodus 12 - preparation time for the feasts is from the 10th to the 14th day of Nisan / Aviv which is the 1st Month of the year | | Yeshua had a meal with disciples then was arrested later that night/morning after praying in the garden | | Yeshua Crucified at 9 a.m. Yeshua Died at 3 p.m. Yeshua placed in tomb before sundown just before the High Sabbath began | | Feast of Unleavened Bread represents our lives without sin / leaven (leaven / yeast is what makes food decay over time just as sin decays the mind, body and soul if allowed). YHVH told Moses since they were leaving early in morning not to make bread with leaven for the bread has no time to rise | | Women purchased and prepared spices to anoint Yeshua's body after High Sabbath, but before Weekly Sabbath | | All rested on the Sabbath according to the Commandment given to Moses. Yeshua resurrected at the end of this day exactly 3 days and 3 nights to be our First Fruits Offering | |
| | The sacrifice was done between the evenings at 3p.m. | | | | | | | | | | Women brought the spices to anoint Yeshua's body while it was still dark just after Weekly Sabbath was over and found that He had already risen | |
